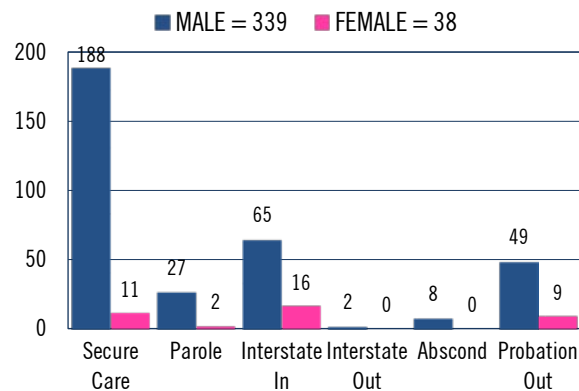

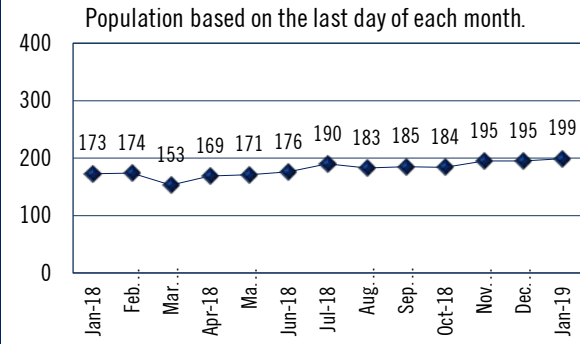

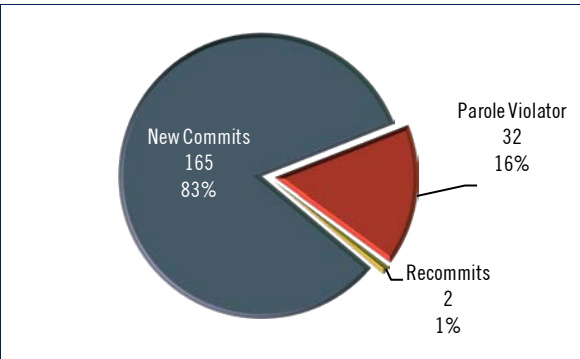
## AGENCY POPULATION BREAKDOWN

## SECURE CARE POPULATION BY STATUS

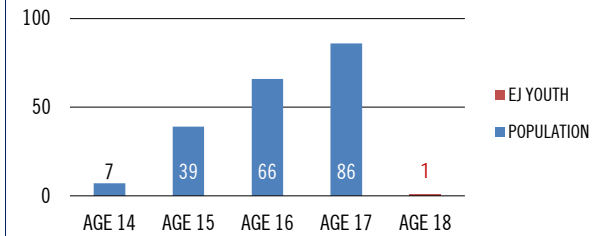

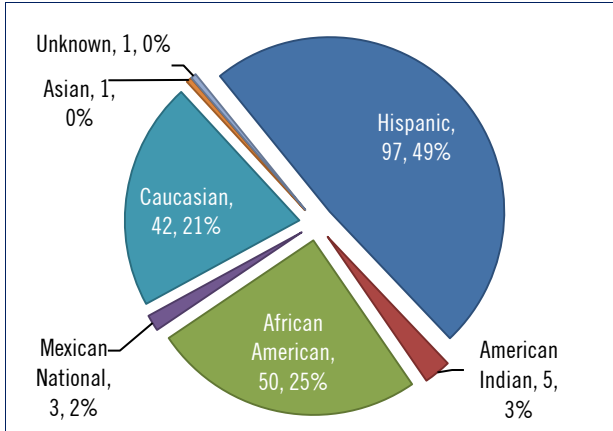

## SECURE CARE AGE DISTRIBUTION

HB 2356, Extended Jurisdiction requires the juvenile court to retain jurisdiction over a juvenile who is at least 17 years old and who has been adjudicated delinquent, until the person reaches 19 years old, if the state files a notice of intent to retain jurisdiction. Requires the court to order continued probation and treatment services until the juvenile adjudicated delinquent reaches 19 years old or services are terminated by the court. Effective: August 3, 2018
