As we continue to see COVID-19 spread throughout our community, we have made the decision to continue limiting access to Adobe Mountain School to essential employees only in order to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and protect the health and safety of youth and staff at Adobe Mountain School. **This includes extending the suspension of in-person volunteer services until August 16, 2020.**

Last week, we implemented virtual religious services. We greatly appreciate the flexibility of our volunteers as we begin utilizing technology to connect religious volunteers with groups of youth at Adobe Mountain School. We will now begin implementing other virtual volunteer services. ADJC Volunteer Coordinator Leonard Braxton is working with Arizona State University students to pilot virtual tutoring, and he will be in contact with other volunteers to provide more detailed information regarding this effort.

We know you are eager to return to Adobe Mountain School and resume in-person interactions with youth. Your partnership and commitment are invaluable, and we look forward to resuming in-person volunteer services as soon as safely possible.

We urge you to please continue to practice healthy hygiene habits and prevent the spread of COVID-19 by:

- Washing your hands throughout the day with soap and water for at least 20 seconds
- Using an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available
- Avoiding touching your eyes, mouth, and nose
- Covering your cough and sneeze with a tissue or with your elbow or shoulder
- Staying home when you are sick
- Disinfecting common spaces and frequently touched surfaces
- Maintaining social distancing
- Wearing a mask
